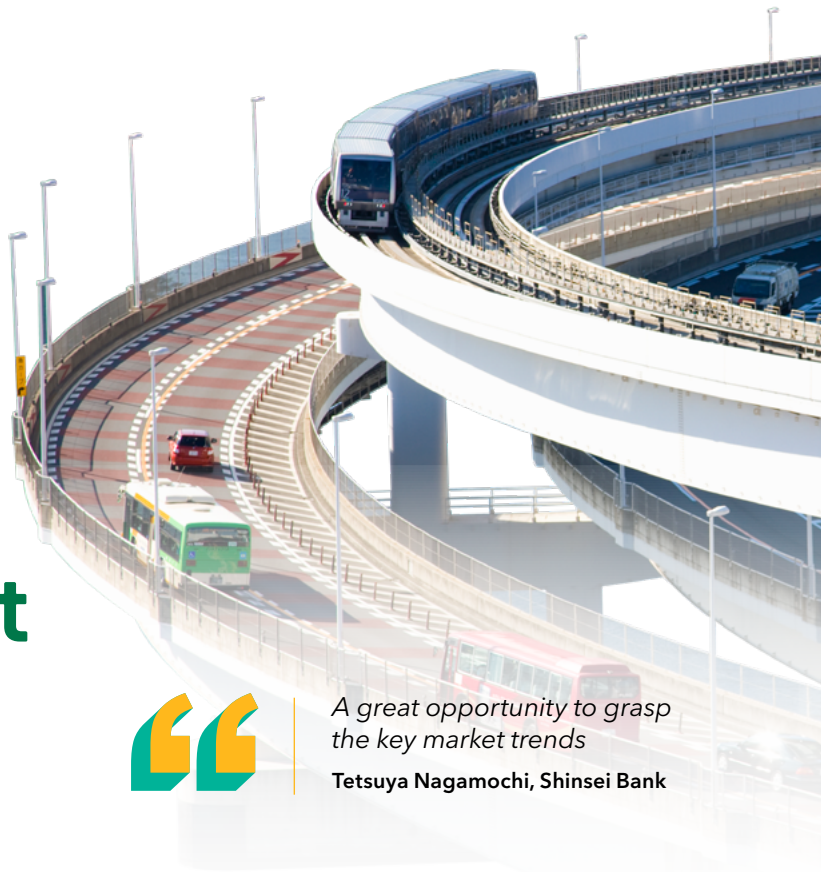

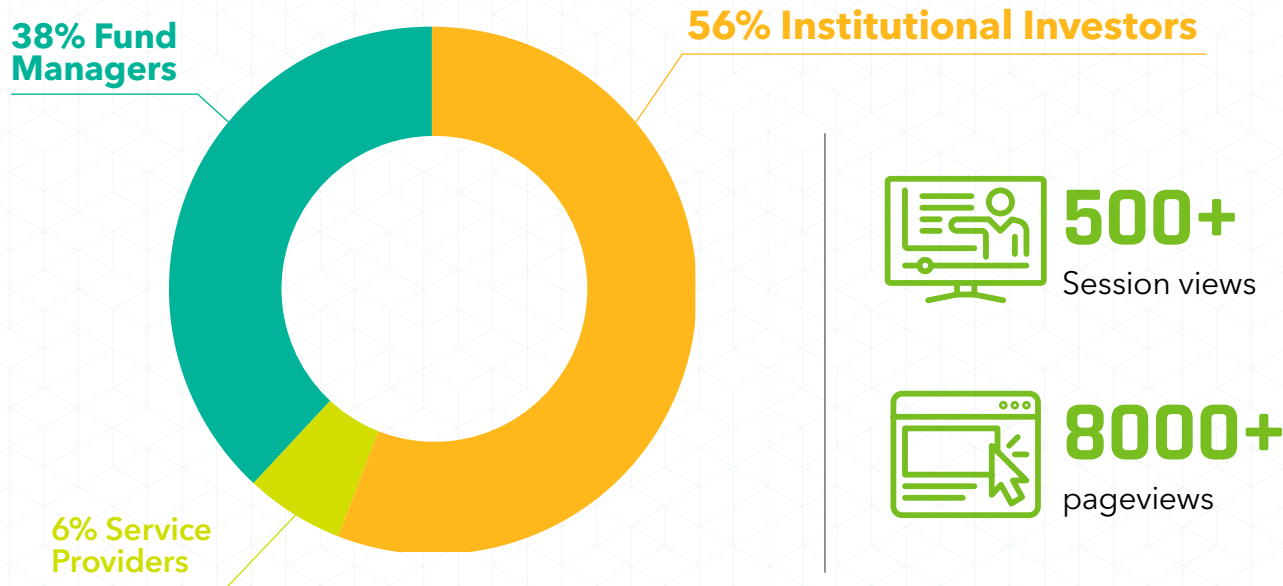
The Infrastructure Investor Tokyo Forum 2021 successfully connected the industry this April. Investors and managers joined the online event for insightful discussions and networking.

The evolution of Japan as an infrastructure investing destination



In terms of the impact of covid, we have been directly impacted. There's the disappearance of inbound demand, especially international flights. From January to December calendar year, international passenger number compared to the previous year, where it used to be 25 million, is down to 3.5 million. Close to 90% reduction.
